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1. Scope of the Ministry

1.1 Purview

Strengthening and promoting local industrial sector by adoption of advanced strategies in order to earn relatively large profit in the context of global competition by establishing links with the local, regional and international supply network through diversification of industries.

1.2 Subjects and Functions

Providing policy guidance to relevant State Ministries, and formulating policies in relation to the subject of Industries, in conformity with the prescribed Laws, Acts and Ordinances, implementation of projects under the National budget, state Investment and National Development Programme, and formulating, implementing, monitoring and evaluating policies, programmes and projects, related to subjects and functions under below mentioned Departments, State Corporations and Statutory Institutions for the creation of a "conducive business environment to promote domestic industries" based on the national policies implemented by the government.

(As per the Extra Ordinary Gazette Notification No. 2187/27 dated 06.10.2020)

1.3 Duties and Functions

(Extraordinary Gazette No.2289/43 dated 22.07.2022 and Extraordinary Gazette No.2303/17 dated 26.10.2022)

- Formulation, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of policies, programmes and projects, in relation to the subject of Industries, and those subjects that come under the purview of Departments, Statutory Institutions and Public Corporations listed in Column II based on the national policies implemented by the government.
- 2. Provision of public services under the purview of the Ministry in an efficient and people friendly manner.
- 3. Reforming all systems and procedures using modern management techniques and technology, thus ensuring that the functions of the Ministry are fulfilled while eliminating corruption and waste.
- 4. Formulating and implementing mechanisms to strengthen existing industries and broadening investment opportunities to create access to new industrial fields.
- 5. Implementing a programme to resuscitate businesses and failed industries.
- 6. Protecting and strengthening local entrepreneurs and businessmen.
- 7. Implementing an integrated programme with relevant institutions for resolving issues faced by all industrialists.

- 8. Establishing a single integrated mechanism for executing import-export process in an efficient manner.
- 9. Formulating and implementing policies, programmes and projects covering all provinces to strengthen export related production process.
- 10. Providing necessary facilities for the development of infrastructure facilities in Industrial Estates.
- 11. Explore by adoption of modern high-technology, mineral resources that are expected to be found underground and in the sea, and exploiting such resources to strengthen the countries' production process.
- 12. Development of small and medium scale enterprises.
- 13. Prioritizing and encouraging the promotion of rural industries including rattan, brass, pottery, furniture as value addition industries.
- 14. Providing opportunities and incentives for the cultivation of raw materials in state lands on a long term lease basis under a cooperative system as a remedial measure to resolve problems of raw materials in relation to carpentry, rattan industry and reed industry.
- 15. Providing remedies to problems of raw material supplies faced by timber and furniture producers.
- 16. Resolving problems of raw material supplies and market access for traditional industries such as foundry industry.

- 17. Expanding the production and supply of garments in the local market in Sri Lanka, and developing the tourism market for local garments.
- 18. Formulating a programme for the supply of dyes and other high quality raw material required for the Batik industry.
- 19. Implementing a special programme for popularizing Batik and Handloom industry locally and abroad.
- 20. Taking measures for the creation of a textile marketing cities.
- 21. Taking measures to operate textile production market in an open and competitive manner.
- 22. Promotion and regulation of the gem and jewellery industry and trade.
- 23. Modernizing gem and mineral resources based industries through a competitive creative approach with the private sector.
- 24. Restricting the export of gems without value addition, and instead promote the export of value added gem based products.
- 25. Provide training opportunities for obtaining latest technical know-how for those involved in the gem related industry and those interested in the industry.
- 26. Taking steps to simplify the licensing process required for the gem industry.








• Manufacturing sub sector Performance - 2021




